Ghana to experience 25% drop in berth cargo.

“Data gathered from shippers indicates that due to the effect of the Russia-Ukraine war, cargo traffic into the country would dip as about 25 percent of wheat and fertilizer import to the country were from Ukraine and Russia,” Mr. Michael Luguje, GPHA Director-General stated.
